# **Time In versus Time Out**

In our last newsletter a technique called "Re-Do" was explained. "Time "n versus Time Out" utilizes the Re-Do while also incorporating "Time In." With Time-In, rather than sending a child to another room, the child is asked to sit quietly in the same room with you until they are able to "Re-Do" the behavior. Many foster or adoptive children are already dealing with issues of abandonment. This technique promotes a healthy, secure connection with your child.

Dr. Karyn Purviss has been instrumental in developing and teaching the Trust Based Relational Intervention to parents of children who have come from a trauma based past.

# **Crafts & Activities**

### **Beaded Wind Chimes**

### <u>Materials:</u>

- Pipe cleaner
  Strings
- Big beads
  Small bells

Drinking straws

- Metal shank button or 
  metal washer
  - Poster or acrylic paint
- Scissors

Paint brushes

Hole punch

### **Directions:**



Trim a paper cup to a height of approximately 2 to 3 inches.



Punch 4 evenly-spaced holes around the cup's mouth.



Paint the paper cup with poster paint. \*Use acrylic paint if the surface of your paper cup is glossy or waxy.



Cut 4 equal lengths of string 12 inches long. Cut a 5th that is 2 inches longer. Tie a small bell at the end of 4 of the strings. Set the 5th string aside for the pendulum.



Cut drinking straws into <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> to 1-inch long pieces.



String beads and drinking straws through each of the 4 strings. Leave an allowance of 1.5 to 2 inches at the top of each string.



Attach the beaded strings around the painted paper cup by securing the top end of each string around the punched-out holes.



To make the pendulum, trim a pipe cleaner to around 6 inches and make a loop on one end.



Tie one end of the 5th string through the loop on the pipe cleaner.



Attach a metal shank button or metal washer on the other end of the string.



Punch a small hole at the center of the paper cup base.



Attach the pendulum to the wind chimes by inserting the end of the pipe cleaner through the hole at the center of the cup. Pull all the way through. The loop on the pipe cleaner serves as a stopper.



Check if the metal button or washer is at the same level as the bells. Loop the pipe cleaner on top to make the wind chimes' handle.

Hang the wind chimes where it can catch a soft breeze.

## **Foster Parents of the Year**

This year's Foster Parents of the Year, Eric & Vickie Eging, were honored at this year's Foster Parent Appreciation Dinner held at Blazin' Bills in Burton The Eging's have fostered 25 children over the years. They were certified in Texas for 4 years, and adopted 2 boys that had been in foster care for 10 years. After moving to Ohio, Eric and Vickie were certified with Beechbrook for 4 years and in 2011 became certified with Geauga County.

When asked what is the best part of working with Geauga County JFS they said "*There is great communication! They always* come up with answers to problems. They have never felt they are alone in the process. They feel huge support from the agency and the social workers care and know their children that are on their caseloads."

The Eging's have been described by others as:

"They have incredible insight into the individual needs of each child and follow through with anything the children need. They are always positive and optimistic and never appear to be overwhelmed!"

"They have developed especially positive relationships with both biological families and agency staff. This family has worked to facilitate reunification and has invited the birth parents into their home."

"Most importantly always have the children's best interests in mind."

"This family sets aside family time to ensure that they all spend time together and each child gets individual time as well."

# Recipes

#### **Carved Watermelon Fruit Salad**



#### **Ingredients:**

- Watermelon
- Favorite fruits
