## Sautéed Irish Cabbage with Noodles

Servings: 6 **Ingredients:** 

4 oz egg noodles ½ pound bacon, chopped 10 cups cabbage shredded I medium onion chopped Salt & Pepper



#### **Directions:**

- ١. Cook noodles in salted boiling water. Drain, set aside
- 2. Sauté bacon in a skillet and set aside.
- 3. In the same skillet with the bacon drippings, add onion and sauté until tender. Add cabbage and sauté until warmed through.
- 4. Now add the bacon and noodles, tossing to heat through. Season with salt and pepper.

# Banana Split Ice-Cream Sand-

wiches

Servings: 18 sandwiches

**Ingredients:** 

2 T butter or margarine I pint (2 cups) strawberry ice cream, softened 36 marshmallows (8 oz)

I medium banana, very thinly sliced

6 cups Chocolate puff cereal

#### **Directions:**

- 1. Line Jelly roll pan, 15 ½ X 10 ½ X 1 inch, with aluminum foil. Spray foil with cooking spray.
- 2. Place butter in large microwavable bowl. Microwave uncovered on High about 30 seconds or until melted. Stir in marshmallows. Microwave on High 1-3 minutes, stir every 30 seconds, until marshmallows are melted and smooth. Stir in cereal. Spoon mixture into pan; spread evenly and firmly. Freeze 15 minutes.
- 3. Turn pan upside down onto cutting board; remove foil. Cut into 18 squares. Spoon 1/4 cup of ice cream onto 9 of the squares; spread lightly. Place 4 bananas slices on each. Top with remaining squares; press slightly. Freeze about 45 minutes or until firm.
- 4. Cut each sandwich crosswise in half, wrap in waxed paper and

We would like to recommend Jeffery as someone you may meet. want to Jeffery has been described as friendly, outgoing, helpful and happy. He likes sports and plans on participating in basketball, baseball and softball through Special Olympics. He likes the Pittsburgh Steelers and Louis Cardinals. Jeffrey likes animals, helping people and shooting hoops. He

also enjoys golfing and learning new skills. As many teenagers he will eat almost anything, well except for olives and mushrooms! So as long as you do not put olives and mushrooms on his part of the pizza, sounds like he would fit in well with many families.

Jeffery gets along well with most kids his age. He is working at Good Will in hopes of gaining experience in the work force. In school he is doing well. Jeffrey has been diagnosed with Borderline Developmental Disability and is on an IEP. He may be eligible to remain in school until he is 22 to continue learning Independent Living skills in order to be self-sufficient. Jeff is learning many independent living skills that he will be able to use in the future. He has his own checking account and is beginning to take more responsibility for himself

While Jeff is looking for a family, he wants to maintain contact with his birth family. Jeffery would like to remain in his current foster home as he has been there for over a year. During this past year Jeffery has made huge improvements socially and therapeutically. He has matured and is very polite and respectful. Jeffrey would be a great asset to any family. How about yours? ## **Trust-Based Relational Intervention Training**

Being a foster parent requires special training to cope with the challenges that children may have. Many have been abused or neglected by their birth family or caretakers. Foster families provide a safe and caring environment until they can return home.

Trust Based Relational Intervention is a family relation-based intervention designed for children who have experienced traumas such as maltreatment, neglect, multiple separations, and institutionalization. TBRI training is being brought to Geauga county in April for

parents, caretakers and professionals. Training emphasizes three intervention principles: Empowering, Connecting, and Correcting. The goal is to educate those working with at-risk children to provide simple and effective ways to help build trust, form attachments, and reach their full potential. The foundation of the TBRI approach is to provide the opportunity for playful engagement and safe interaction. The use of value scripts, role plays, and redo's are prevalent as well as conveying the importance of appropriate nutrition and stabilized

blood sugar to provide the greatest opportunity for success.

Training will be held Saturday, April 21st at Metzenbaum Center 8200 Cedar Road. Training is free and child care will be available.
