GEAUGA COUNTY RESIDENTS! If you are...

- Parents/caretakers of minor children (children age 0-18)
- Children under age 19
- Pregnant woman

And are not currently eligible for Medicaid coverage, you may be eligible under the Affordable Care Act for coverage starting January 1, 2014.



 Ask your physician for alternatives to opiate-based pain medications (Vicodin, Percocet, Oxycordin, or Oxycodone) which are frequently abused. Abusers often move onto heroin, which is much cheaper, easier to buy, and offers an even more intense high.
